**PRESIDENT'S CORNER**

It is with great sadness that I report the sudden death of Captain Owen Englander, USN (Ret) on Sunday December 18, 2011. Captain Englander was a lifetime member of TROA/ MOAA. Owen served as Vice President and President of the Southwest Oregon Chapter from 1988-1993. In 1994, he moved to Pensacola and joined the ESCAROSA Chapter, now the Pensacola Chapter, and immediately became a Director. Since 1997 Captain Englander has served as the 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President, President, two terms as immediate past president and two terms as Director. He served as the Chairman of the National Legislative Affairs Committee and the Chairman of the Bylaws Committee. From 2003 -2005 he served as the Northwest Area Vice President, Florida Council of Chapters. He also served as the Chairman of the Resolutions and Bylaws Committee for the Florida Council of Chapters. He received the 2007 and 2010 MOAA communications award for best legislative coverage. He also received the MOAA Gold Lapel Pin leadership award for his more than 20 years of legislative affairs work and contributions to TROA/PMOAA. In addition to being a monthly contributor to the Beacon with his Legislative Affairs columns, he, until recently, maintained PMOANET – an email advisory call to chapter members and interested parties who support the interests of the military community. Captain Englander shall be truly missed by members of PMOAA and the Florida Council of Chapters.

I am also sad to report that Captain Dick Thomas, Chairman of the Survivor Assistance Committee has had to step down as chair due to health reasons. Captain Thomas has done a commendable job in providing a much needed service for members and their families during difficult times. He has expended numerous hours and was never too busy to help. His accomplishments, his can do attitude and his willingness to serve are greatly admired. We offer him a deep and heartfelt thank you and wish him well.

On a more pleasant note the PMOAA membership was treated to great music by "The Blenders" at the annual Christmas dinner dance at New World Landing. About 40 members and their guests dined, danced, and were awarded the opportunity to select

from a host of door prizes provided by the Board of Directors. ## DEFENSE FINANCE AND ACCOUNTING SERVICE (DFAS) DEATH NOTIFICATION

Defense Finance and Accounting Service officials report that survivors can now use a "fast form" to report the passing of a retiree on the Internet rather than waiting on the phone. The DFAS Form 9221 for notification of death can be processed quicker than faxed or mailed forms, said officials, and they save paper and postage costs. Officials warn that if a survivor doesn't receive confirmation of receipt from DFAS within 48 hours of submitting the form, they should call 800-321-1080. The form can be completed and submitted online from the privacy of a customer's home, or with the help of a casualty assistance representative. Submitting the form initiates all of the same actions a DFAS customer care center representative would:

- ⇒The retiree's account will be suspended to avoid re-lease of monthly payments.
- ⇒A standard Form 1174 claim form will be sent to the retiree's arrears-of-pay beneficiary.
- ⇒If the decedent was enrolled in the Survivor Benefit Plan or the Retired Serviceman's Family Protection Plan, an annuitant care package will be sent to the beneficiary.

The notification-of-death form is only for reporting the death of a military retiree. Annuitant deaths must still be reported to one of the DFAS customer care representatives at 800-321-1080. For submission Part A and B are required. Part A is information about the deceased. Part B is information about the person making this report. DFAS would appreciate any information that you can provide in Part C and D. This information will be used to contact the retiree's beneficiaries in order to facilitate the payment of any outstanding retiree pay. To obtain the fastest service, click "Submit" at the bottom of the internet page after you have filled out the form. You may also fax it to 800-469-6559 or mail it to DFAS at: P.O. Box 7130, London, KY 40742-7130.

## Pensacola Chapter Newsletter - January 2012 - Military Officers Association of America

### PMOAA BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

12 December 2011

President Limbach called the meeting to order at 1530 at Azalea Trace with the following members present: CDR Milheim, CPT Schneider, RADM Engel, COL Cook, CAPT Frazier, LCDR Beeby, LtCol Mayhugh and MAJ Fitzgerald. Members excused: MAJ Werner and CDR VonLorenz. Others present: CAPT Englander.

A motion was made by CPT Schneider, seconded by MAJ Fitzgerald that the 21 November minutes be approved. Motion carried.

**Treasurer Report:** COL Cook reported that increasing the dues to \$20.00 per person has stopped the bleeding. Approximately 135 members have paid their 2012 dues and \$2300 has been received in scholarship donations. The donation form periodically published in the Beacon needs to be continued. COL Cook also reported that the status of the audit has bogged down as he has received no response from the auditor despite repeated attempts. Another individual, not a certified auditor, has helped PMOAA prepare tax forms in the past. He has concerns about doing the audit. The change to the bylaws approved by the membership at our November business meeting provided that "(an audit) on the occasion of relief of the holder of the office of the Treasurer shall include an outside, professional accountant/auditor." It was, and remains, the intent of the board of this change was to provide a "compilation and review" of the chapter account, rather than a more formal audit in the strict legal sense of the term. A motion was made by CDR Milheim, seconded by CAPT Frazier that the chapter will operate on "compilation and review status. Captain Englander will provide the verbiage necessary to make a change in the bylaws at the November 2012 business meeting. COL Cook will continue to pursue this issue. Signatures were obtained to complete the bank requirements.

### COMMITTEE REPORTS

**Legislative and Bylaws** – CAPT Englander reported that nothing has happened or moved since his last Beacon article. The Defense Authorization Act for 2012 is still pending with approximately 75-100 amendments proposed in the Senate. DIC and Concurrent receipt haven't progressed due to the lack of funding offsets being identified. The same applies for the Senate's proposal for reduced payroll tax. Republicans did identify funding sources but they were defeated. Stay tuned.

**Membership** – CPT Schneider attended the UWF commissioning ceremony on 9 December and presented the MOAA gold bars to one newly commissioned 2Lt. Two new members have been recruited. The FCOC newsletter gave kudos to Pensacola for their recruiting efforts. MOAA will be sending out 1500 letters to non chapter members extending an invitation to hear Col Lange speak on 19 January 2012.

**Scholarship** – CAPT Frazier stated that the 2012 essay topic has been selected – "Why it is important to support and defend the Constitution of the United States."

### OLD BUSINESS

- Christmas party was a good event thanks to the efforts of MAJ Fitzgerald for his choice of the band, as well as his participation in the band, and Christine Frazier and Debi Milheim for the beautiful table decorations.

- Winter President's Meeting (13-14 January in West Palm Beach) – the President, Secretary, 2<sup>nd</sup> VP and NW AVP will attend.

- Convention Volunteers – CPT Schneider reported as of this date, there have been no volunteers for the convention.

An article will be placed in the January edition of the Beacon to solicit volunteers.

- Communication Awards are due 1 February. PMOAA will submit 3 entries: the web site, the Beacon and CAPT Englander's legislative column.

- January Memorial Service/Installation of Officers – will be held on 19 January at the Pensacola Yacht Club. The SAR honor guard will be present. Guest speaker and installation officer is Col Lee Lange from MOAA. He will also present PMOAA with the 5 Star banners. CAPT Englander will man the bell at the Memorial Service.

- Membership Spotlight – no report.

### NEW BUSINESS

- Southwest Florida Military ball invitation on 11 February in Naples, Florida – information will be placed in the Beacon.

- PMOAA sent a sympathy card to John Snyder on the passing of his wife.

- Chapter Bylaws – changes approved at the November business meeting have been made. President and Secretary signed revised bylaws in front of the board.

- Memorial Service draft is in progress. Will investigate the death of Nilobon Dean who passed away in May. We appreciate his wife calling this to our attention. The 2011 deceased list will be published in the January Beacon. If names are missing, would appreciate notification. The list is also published on the PMOAA website.

- CAPT Dick Thomas, chair of the Survivor Assistance committee has resigned because of health reasons. CAPT Bill Mayer will assume the chair position. PMOAA extends their deepest thanks and appreciation to CAPT Thomas for the tremendous amount of time and energy he gave to the families of deceased members.

- 2012 PMOAA proposed schedule of events and meetings was discussed. Scheduled will be published in the Beacon yet everyone should be aware that the schedule is incomplete and may be subject to change especially the March date. Recommendations are being accepted for guest speakers for the following months: May, August, September, October and November. Please contact CPT Schneider if you have a suggestion.

- Addendum to Directory – CDR Milheim recommended that an addendum to the directory be published in April 2012 listing new members, address changes, etc.

- Other – LtCol Limbach expressed his thanks and appreciation to all officers and board members and general membership for their tremendous support during his tenure as President.

Beacon deadline is NLT COB on Tuesday, 27 December. Early submissions encouraged. The next Board meeting will be on Tuesday, 24 January at 1530 at Azalea Trace. Meeting adjourned at 1640.
